1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution

The curricular and co-curricular programmes were in line with the institution's goals and objectives. The curriculum and syllabus addressed the needs of society through value education, environmental education and self development through educational psychology and sensitization to equality and equity. ICT also has been included in the curriculum.

We have formulated our mission of training well motivated teachers who are intellectually competent, morally upright, socially and professionally committed and spiritually inspired in order to become instruments of social transformation. It is satisfying to note that there was a concerted effort by the faculty and staff to achieve this aim. Our students have done well in various areas of their training. Our college stands today as one of the best college of education in the state.

2. New academic Programmes initiated (UG and PG)

No new academic U.G/P.G Programmes was introduced during the session 2010-2011. We have applied to the Tamil Nadu Teacher Education University to start M.Phil Programme in Education and it is under consideration of authorities of the university.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

The college is affiliated to Tamilnadu Teachers Education University, Chennai. The curriculum design is the sole right of board of studies in education of

the university. Hence the college is bound to follow the curriculum designed and approved by the authorities. College has adopted the newly prepared syllabus by the university for B.Ed during the session 2011-2012 For other courses it is as before. B.Ed. staff members attended curriculum design programme conducted by the university. The specific subjects are taught as per direction of the university authorities who decide the curricular design. However we provide knowledge to our students by adopting newer technology related academic activity.

4. Inter-Disciplinary Programmes Started

The college has not started any interdisciplinary courses. In view of importing value education to prospective teachers we conduct certificate and Diploma Course in Gandhian Thought and Vivekananda Thought.

5. Examination Reforms Implemented

The college is bound to follow the examination system to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University to which our college is affiliated and the examination procedures of the university can be neither denied nor modified. But the college has its own internal ways of improving the student quality through examination system adopted for the same viz. unit test, weekly test, first terminal test, Model Exam I, Model Exam II and assignments, etc.

Our university has changed the system of internal marks and practical marks in the examination during the Academic year 2010-2011 onwards.

Moreover marks obtained are arranged in serial order of merit and displayed on the notice Board for the intimating the students.

In B.Ed., course total marks should be allotted for 1,000

Core paper – I, II & III

Major – Optional I & Optional II

Elective – 1

Practical examinations having 400 marks and theory papers having 600 marks and they totally 1,000 marks.

M.Ed., course has 5 theory papers (500 marks) and dissertation has 200 marks and totally 700 marks.

And they participated more National, International Seminars, Guest Lectures, Workshop and handling classes of correspondence courses in Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Madurai Kamaraj University, IGNOU and Tamil Nadu Open University and etc.
